Join the slow roll!

Saskatoon Cycles will be leading a slow roll throughout our festival site, following this exact path. Everyone is welcome to join in on the Saskatoon Cycles slow roll!

To join the slow roll, meet up with the Saskatoon Cycles crew at the front doors of City Hall at 7:00 PM for a brief overview of the route and some safe biking tips. The slow roll will start promptly at 7:10.

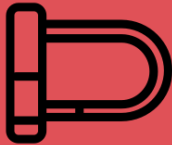
Tips for Enjoying Your Evening:
